

LENT

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, which lands on <u>March 5th</u> this year. As is customary among many churches, as with Trinity, we will have a worship service in which Ashes are administered. <u>Trinity's service will be held at 7 pm.</u>

The ashes remind us of our mortality and our mortality reminds us of the consequences of our sinful nature. During the service, we participate in a service of confession, which symbolically remains unfinished.

That is, it does not conclude with an "absolution", or the pronouncement of forgiveness, but simply with a promise, that will consummate in the Maundy Thursday service when we celebrate Jesus' gift of Holy Communion.

As we move through the five weeks of this Lenten Season, and Palm/Passion Sunday, we will explore the notion of "Repentance." This is one of those churchy words, but it is filled with power and nuance.

The hope is that exploring repentance will lead us to Holy Week with a fuller understanding and experience to receive the gift of Holy Week and Easter.

We hope you will join us on March 5th and each of the succeeding Sundays to explore this powerful notion that helps us explore our humanity and the grace of the one who calls us to transcend it.

New Directions for the Hope of Trinity Submitted by Pastor John & Al Corbett

In a recent release, the Pew Research Center has shared that the percentage of persons identifying as "Christians" is now at 62% as compared to 78% in 2007. Despite this, the large majorities, believe people have a soul, believe in God or some universal spirit, believe there is something spiritual beyond the natural world, and believe in heaven, hell or both.

While 44% of adults say they pray daily and 33% say the attend religious services monthly, the projection of young people being religiously connected is not hopeful.

The study does not tell us why these trends are at play. That is for us to both study and hypothesize about.

What is Church?

Most of us speak about Church as a location and building. Some talk about it as an activity (largely associated with worship) at a certain time and day. Others speak about it as an organization, with a constitution, polity and organizational chart.

However, Paul defines it as "the body of Christ" and "the people of God" wherever they are, and when they are sharing the Gospel of Joy, Peace and Hope!

The story of the Church is that eleven followers were hiding and bewildered and suddenly a Spirit came upon them, animated them and called them to speak to others and give hope. They met people in their communities, amidst their work, in their homes and brought hope and faith to them. They scattered and traveled across the world telling about Jesus and God's love. That is the Church.

Trinity needs to find a way to relate with others in a manner that will allow others to be attracted to hear this good news, and that is why we are engaged in this process to see if there is another way to engage with others, help them to understand the deep impact faith can make in their lives, and to give away what had been given to us as a gift in the first place.

The Process:

The process is to help Trinity to provide something the world might want, and what humanity needs. People are less and less attracted to a Sunday morning gathering in pews. Our mission is the same: A) To experience God's love; B) to Love as we have been Loved, C) To proclaim God's care to the world, D) To invite others to experience God's Love more personally, and E) to call everyone and everything to be transformed by God's love.

On February 9th we heard about examples of churches who left behind the ways and things they were doing to do things differently. Some built schools or kitchens or became safe havens for people who were vulnerable. Some built housing. Some worked with elderly, others with youth. Some built housing and provided opportunities for people to learn skills, open businesses and find ways that would provide vitality.

On February 23rd, we discussed some of the qualities we might try to assess how and with what emphasis we might try to make. Some of those qualities are:

- Impact: Making a significant difference to individuals and to the community
- Engagement: Choosing activities where we can engage others and invite them into activities we are also interested
 in. but to also share how these activities are consistent with our faith
- Missional Connectedness: Making sure that what we are doing is consistent with the mission we have been given and might help others to connect with faith
- Resources: Making sure we have the resources to make this happen
- Partners: Determining who else might share our interest and might support our work
- Timeliness: Making sure we can get things done soon enough
- Sustainability: Making sure this engagement can last for as long as it needs to
- Unanimity: Making sure we have the support of nearly everyone in the congregation.
- Loss/Sacrifice: Addressing what we are willing to sacrifice for these efforts
- Faithfulness: Making sure that what we are doing is a faithful expression of who and what God calls us to be.

March 9th and March 23rd: During these sessions we will be brain storming ideas. This means we want everyone to think of ways we could remodel how we do ministry including who the audience we might be looking to address, what need we would be addressing, and what that might look like. So we need you to put on your thinking caps and your praying hearts and share ideas. All ideas will be welcome, and then we will see if they connect with other people's ideas as well.

In succeeding months we will flesh out ideas and hold them to some of the criteria we identified above.


